Dr. Noreen Golfman is a Professor of English and holds a PhD from Western University. She stepped down as Provost and Vice President (Academic) of Memorial University in April 2020 after more than six years serving in the position to return to teaching; previously, she held the roles of Dean and Associate Dean of the School of Graduate Studies. She served two terms as President of the Canadian Federation for the Humanities and Social Sciences, and is past President of both the Canadian Association for Graduate Studies and the Northeastern Association of Graduate Schools.

Dr. Golfman was also Chair of the Board of Friends of Canadian Broadcasting, a watchdog advocacy group (1998-2020); founding director of the St. John's International Women's Film Festival, the second-longest running women's film festival in the world; and has worked as broadcaster, reviewer and social commentator for CBC. In 2020, the Alliance of Canadian Cinema, Television and Radio Artists (ACTRA) named Dr. Golfman their Woman of the Year.
